The absence of a standardized system for antenatal care meant that pregnant women were not receiving the timely and appropriate interventions needed to ensure healthy pregnancies. Without dedicated spaces and resources, Anganwadi workers were unable to deliver consistent care, monitor progress effectively, or identify risks that required referrals to higher healthcare facilities. This situation highlighted a critical need for a solution that could standardize antenatal care delivery at the community level, ensuring that all pregnant women receive the necessary care throughout their pregnancy.

Synopsis:

The ANC (Antenatal Care) Tables project was initiated to address the gaps in antenatal care services at Anganwadi centers across the Bokaro district. As part of an initiative to strengthen health systems under SDG Goal 3: Good Health and Well-being, these tables were introduced to equip Anganwadi workers with the tools needed to deliver consistent, comprehensive, and standardized antenatal care.

The ANC Tables serve as a dedicated station for maternal health services, providing the necessary infrastructure to monitor vital signs, offer nutritional guidance, track immunizations, and maintain health records in a centralized location. This project aims to improve the quality of antenatal care by ensuring that all pregnant women receive timely interventions and appropriate care throughout their pregnancy.

By introducing these tables, the project seeks to reduce maternal and infant mortality rates, improve pregnancy outcomes, and educate mothers about the importance of regular check-ups and healthy practices during pregnancy.
